Peoples' Ponderings

Friday 27th October marked the 50th Anniversary of the Abortion Act in our Country. The Bishops Conference of Scotland with the Conference of England and Wales have issued a joint statement to mark this sad anniversary; copies of which are available from Fr Neil. The dignity of human life is something that we as Catholics must defend from conception to natural death. It is an opinion that is being pushed more and more to the side lines as we have seen with the banning of prayer vigils outside abortion clinics. One of the common lies said about the pro-life movement is that we are just pro-birth and that we don't care about the mother or what happens to the child afterwards. Nothing could be further from the truth, as Catholics we must care for all human life and to care particularly for those mothers who made the hard decision to have an abortion. A priest once told me the story of how he visited a young woman who was planning to have an abortion, he prayed with her, talked with her and tried to show her the other options available. She decided to have the abortion and when she came out of the operation she was shocked to see the priest waiting for her and asked why he was there. His reply was: 'there was two people here I loved, one is still here'. So let us pray for all those who have been affected by abortion over these 50 years, that they may feel God's love for them.
