Pope Francis 'Tweet of the Week':

'The holiness to which the Lord calls you grows through small gestures in everyday life.'

Peoples Ponderings On Monday Pope Francis issued an Apostolic Exhortation called Gaudete et Exsultate which looks at the call to holiness. This is a call that we have all received at our Baptism and something that we should all be aimng for. As Pope Benedict XVI said in one of his homilies on his visit to the UK – 'he hoped that the Saints of the Third Millennium were listening to him'. Gaudete et Exsultate is a beautiful document which looks at the ways in which we can achieve holiness in our lives. It is written in a way that draws on the experiences of day to day lives. Now much of what Pope Francis suggests is well known in Catholic life: to make time for prayer, to frequent the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Confession, to do a daily examination of conscience, and to read the Gospel regularly. However in this Exhortation Pope Francis highlights the connection between these "spiritual" activities and *actions* Eucharist and Confession, to do a daily examination of conscience, and to read the Gospel regularly.
