Peoples Ponderings

As I mentioned in the Reminder last week, I was away for a few days with Bishop Patrick and other priests ordained in the last 10 years. It was a good opportunity for us to gather with the Bishop and to share our experiences of parish life and to have a little bit of a rest. This year we spent a few days in the Cathedral City of Canterbury, it was my first visit and it was good to go on pilgrimage to the site of the murder of St Thomas Beckett, who is the patron Saint for the clergy in England and Wales. We also went to sites connected to the life St Augustine of Canterbury, including the National Shrine where the Architect AW Pugin is buried.

What struck me in the City of Canterbury is the role of the Freemasons in the City. With many visible signs, including a museum and a stained glass window in the Cathedral purchased by them. As a Catholic, I felt slightly uneasy to be in area so clearly steeped in the tradition of Freemasonry, in our discussions as newly ordained priests, it was also felt that many people in our parishes may not be aware of the conflict between the Church and the freemasons. So I thought it might be worth giving a reminder;

The Catholic Church has prohibited Catholics from joining these sort of organisations since 1738 and many Popes since then have reaffirmed this. In 1983, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF) stated that "faithful who enrol in Masonic associations are in a state of grave sin and may not receive Holy Communion" and membership in Masonic associations is prohibited.'

If you have any concerns about this statement, please feel free to come and discuss it with Fr Neil in private.

Novena to keep the Republic of Ireland Pro-Life

On 25th May, the Irish people will vote on whether to repeal the 8th Amendment. The 8th Amendment in Ireland's Constitution prohibits abortion and protects life from conception. Ireland is one of the safest places in the world for mothers and their babies - and we hope that they will keep it that way. Let us pray that the Irish people vote NO to abortion-on-demand on May 25th. **The Novena begins on 16th May.**

Forthcoming Events

- ◆ **St Bernadette's Adoration Chapel.** A Mass will take place on **Thursday 24th May 2018** at 7.00 pm at St Bernadette's to celebrate 25 years since the opening of the Adoration Chapel. This is a great achievement and is due to the dedication of the parishioners who have stayed loyal over the years, including people from this parish. It is also good that we have this celebration of Eucharistic Adoration in the Year when we have the Eucharistic Congress in Liverpool.
- ◆ **Corpus Christi Procession in Crowle - 10th June.** We hope that people from across the deanery will attend this year. The procession will start at 2.00 pm end with Benediction and a chance for people to have a picnic in the grounds of St Norbert's school. - ◆ **Baptism Course - Holy Souls and St Norbert's**
The next course will take place in the parish hall at Holy Souls on **Thursday 21st June at 7.00 pm.** If you wish to have your child baptised at either Holy Souls or St Norbert's, you must attend this course. Please note that the times of Baptism will be changing, this is so we do not have to make any last-minute changes due to only one priest being available. **Holy Souls, Sunday, during the 9.00 am Mass or at 1.30 pm. - ◆ **The Dowry Tour 2018-2020.** The Bishops of England have agreed to the rededication of England as the Dowry of Mary around the Solemnity of the Annunciation in 2020. A booklet will shortly be published that explains the history and its meaning. In preparation for the rededication, the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham will visit every Cathedral in England for a three-day Triduum of prayer. This will be accompanied by a unique exhibition on the Dowry of Mary. The first visit will be to the Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral at the end of June 2018.
