**Peoples Ponderings** Last Saturday saw the people of the Republic of Ireland vote overwhelmingly for the introduction of abortion 🖗 in Ireland. This was done by removing the human rights of the unborn child from the constitution. Ireland was a beacon of light in Europe, standing up for all human life from conception to natural death, it has now fallen in to line with the culture of death which covers most of Europe – with Poland now the only one left 🕅 standing, so we must pray that Poland can withstand the attacks it will now face from so called progressives. Seeing the scenes in Dublin Castle as people cheered and cried for joy at the result was truly terrifying - how can it be a moment of national pride and celebration to authorise the killing of the most vulnerable. More worryingly was the exit poll which stated that 68% of yes voters called themselves Catholic. The people of Ireland have clearly turned against the Church due to the horrific crimes and the failure to deal with them by Bishops, Priests and religious. However, the failings of the members of the Church doesn't change the truths that she teaches. This sadly has become lost in the anger. As a Church, Bishops, priests, laity – we have come to a crossroads. We can either fall in line with society or stand up for the truth. I pray that we hold our nerve and continue to proclaim the faith, like many of the martyrs who have gone before us. As Pope Benedict XVI once said 'it seems certain to me that the Church is facing very hard times. The real crisis has scarcely begun. We will have to count on terrific upheavals. But h am equally certain about what will remain at the end: not the Church of the political cult, which is dead already, but the Church of faith. She may well no longer be the dominant social power to the extent that she was until recently; but she will enjoy a fresh blossoming and be seen as man's home, where he will find life and hope beyond death.'
