The importance of Silence

Last week I started to have look at the Mass but made a slight error by starting with the sign of the cross. This missed an important part of our preparation – a time of silent prayer before Mass. The outside world is one of noise, with traffic, music and social media, the Church should be a quiet refuge, a place to be at peace with the Lord. This time of quiet preparation also allows us the chance to recall the people or situations we wish to bring to the Lord during Mass. Cardinal Sarah said in his excellent book on Silence; 'Christ lived for thirty years in silence. Then during his public life, he withdrew to the desert to listen and to speak with his Father. The world vitally needs those who go off into the desert. Because God speaks in the silence.'

Our short times before Mass and after Mass are a great chance for us to enter the desert, to allow God the chance to speak to us. So, I ask that people keep a prayerful silence in the Church before and after Mass, to respect those who may desperately need that time in the Desert with the Lord. I would also encourage people to meet up and chat with people in the Hall or outside Church, as it is also important to speak with each other, but we need to find a balance that insures that God takes priority in his house.
