Peoples Ponderings

At the next meeting of the Diocesan Committees on Church buildings, we will be putting in a variety of proposals. A redecoration plan for Holy Souls and St Norbert's and for new disabled access on the hall at Holy Souls. These are big projects for our parishes and will lead to some disruption when the work is done. I ask that you are patient with us when the work begins - hopefully early in the new year. I think that once the work is completed our churches will be even more beautiful than they currently are.

With regards funding these projects, we are fortunate to have legacies in both parishes and for St Norbert's money from the sale of Luddington (once it goes through). As an assistant priest at St Mary's Derby, I came in at the end of their redecoration of the Lady Chapel (if you ever find yourself in Derby, do go and have a look). The parish, like us, had funds to pay for the work but they used it as an opportunity to raise funds and to have more social events in the parish. I would like to encourage a similar thing here, gathering to celebrate the Eucharist is the key thing in a parish but it is also important to gather for social events and to get to know each other better. If you have any ideas for fundraising please speak to me or a member of the Parish Council. My hope at the end of these projects is that we will have two stunning churches and a community that knows each other better.
