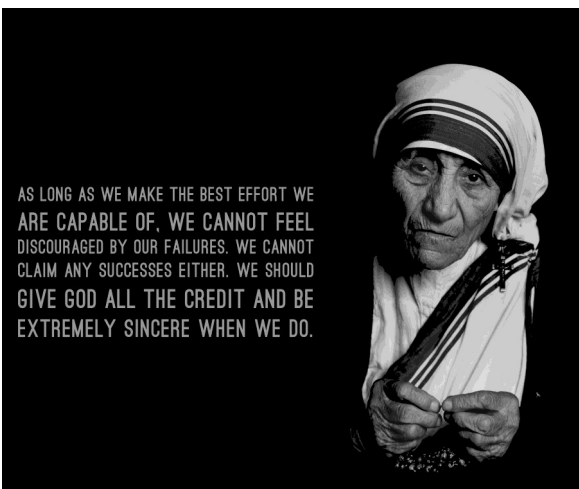

Reflection: Philippians 4:6-9

This warm and affectionate little passage was probably originally the end of a letter from Paul to the community at Philippi which he loved so well. It is a lovely conclusion to a letter. Paul encourages them in every way to be cheerful in the Lord, but especially to be grateful. If we really appreciate that the Lord is near, we cannot worry and the peace of God will rest upon us. Then also gratitude and thanksgiving will be our mode of thought, penetrating all our thoughts on every subject. The word Paul uses for "thanksgiving" is the word for the Eucharist, which is the great prayer of thanksgiving offered by Christ to the Father in the name of us all. It is the summing up of all prayer, petition, gratitude and admiration. No doubt Paul is thinking of it as the high point of all prayer. HW.

A number of people have been "turning up" to attend Sunday Mass without prior booking. **You need to book a place in advance** for the weekend Masses otherwise you risk being turned away. It is only the weekday Masses where you can currently attend without booking although this is being kept under review.

Please stay at home if you, or someone in your household, displays symptoms of Covid 19

In accordance with the Diocesan directive a 2 metre social distancing policy has been implemented in our Churches. This means that only a limited number of worshippers can attend Mass and the Sacraments. As the Sunday obligation continues to be suspended, please consider attending a weekday Mass instead of a weekend Mass, if you are able to do so. This will allow parishioners with work and school commitments on weekdays to be able to attend a Mass at the weekend. Seats at the weekday masses are allocated on a 'first come, first served' basis and there are usually spare seats remaining at these Masses.

By law, you must now wear a face covering in places of worship

You do not need to wear a face covering if you have a legitimate reason not to. This includes (but is not limited to):

- young children under the age of 11 (Public Health England do not recommended face coverings for children under the age of 3 for health and safety reasons)
- not being able to put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability
