St Augustine says "The Lord desired to be baptised, so that he might freely proclaim through his humility what for us was to be a necessity." His Church has always stressed the importance of baptism, from the time the Lord commanded his apostles to go and baptise all the nations, as we read at the end of Matthew's Gospel.

It is transmitted as an "inextricable part of our fallen human nature, by generation not by imitation, and is to be found individually in each one of us" as Pope Paul VI said. It means that left in this state we are unable to please God because we have a natural tendency to sin. We are attracted towards evil as well as towards good. Baptism helps because it washes away original sin, and we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Our Lord's baptism is a good model for us. In it we see that after he was baptised he received the gift of the Holy Spirit, which came down on him visibly in the form of a dove. Then God the Father declared that Jesus was his beloved Son. In baptism the same things happened to us. We received the Holy Spirit, and also became God's sons and daughters. This sacrament changed us forever. William (Bill) Monteith, Malachy Bruce and all who have died recently, may they rest in peace. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen. ********************************
