# The Solemnity of St Joseph, Husband of Mary ~ 19th March

The season of Lent is interrupted by the Solemnity of St Joseph, the husband of Mary. In today's entrance antiphon we hear *The Lord has put his faithful servant in charge of his household.* The household referred to is the Holy Family of Nazareth. God entrusted this treasure to St Joseph, who dedicated his entire life to their care. The Lord's household can also be understood as the Church, which likewise looks to St Joseph as a guardian and patron.

The first reading brings to mind the ancient promises made by God to his chosen people, which were then passed down from generation to generation: the coming of a just and powerful king, the Good Shepherd who will lead his flock to verdant pastures, the Redeemer who will save his people. In this passage from the second book of Samuel, God announces to David that the Messiah will arise from his descendants. The Messiah will found an everlasting kingdom. It is through Joseph that Jesus is the son of David. Christ is the fulfilment of the prophecies made from the time of Abraham.

The Gospel of today's Mass places special emphasis on the fact that Joseph was a member of the House of David: *Jacob was the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ (Matt 1:16).* St Joseph is, therefore, the Patriarch of the New Testament.

Here was an ordinary man to whom God granted extraordinary graces. Joseph was to fulfil a most singular mission in the salvific design of God. He experienced indescribable joys along with the trials of doubt and suffering. We recall his perplexity at the mystery of Mary's conception, at the extreme material poverty in Bethlehem, at the prophecies of Simeon in the Temple, at the hurried flight into Egypt, at the difficulties of having to live in a foreign land, at the return from Egypt and the threat posed by the successor of Herod, Archelaus. Joseph showed himself always faithful to the will of God, always ready to set aside his own human plans and considerations.

The explanation of this remarkable fidelity is that Jesus and Mary were at the centre of Joseph's life. Joseph's self-giving and generosity comes from his loving faith and confident hope. His feast is therefore a good opportunity for us to renew our own commitment to the Christian calling God has given each of us.

We ask the Holy Patriarch of the Church, Joseph, to help us to fulfil the will of God in everything, just as he did. We pray that he will show us how to live out our commitments joyfully and without reservation. Our example will enlighten many others as to their own vocation in life, whether that be the priesthood, religious life, holy matrimony, or the single life. We must remember that the way we live will either help to foster a culture of vocation in the Church, or it will detract from it. We must remember that it is our responsibility to promote vocations in the Church, just as much as it is the responsibility of the parish priest, the vocations director or the bishop. We do this mainly by the serene witness of living out our own vocation faithfully, but also by praying for vocations, and by encouraging others who are suitable to think of a vocation in the Church. We must recall the unfortunate reality that there is a serious shortage of vocations to married life, the priesthood and religious life, three of the key pillars of vocation in the Church. And it is the responsibility of all here, in our own small way, to do something to correct this.

The life of St Joseph reminds us that every home where there are baptized people is a domestic Church, and the Church is present there. Each Christian home is a living cell of the body of Jesus Christ, His Church. The Church is far more than buildings, in fact buildings are less important than anything else about the Church. For the first three centuries of Christianity, long before churches were able to be built, the Church existed in the homes of Christians. The faith was lived and handed down from generation to generation in the home, and the home was the main base for evangelization of

the world, and this is still true today. It is worth noting however, that during this unfortunate period our churches will still be open for private prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. You will find the times available in parish newsletters, websites and notice boards.

Thirdly, we must recall the absolute trust in God of St Joseph, and imitate his example in these difficult times. Yes, there are many things we could be anxious about, but let's put these fears on one side and trust in providence. Whatever happens, God is able to bring many graces to his people even in the midst of suffering. We are God's people, we are in his powerful hands and he is looking after us. Remember St Joseph, whose heart was always alive with joy, even in the most difficult trials.
