Fr Matthew's weekly Catechism St Benedict ~ Feast Day 11th July

We celebrate St Benedict's feast day not on the date of his death which falls in Lent, but on the date of the translation of his relics to Fleury in France in the seventh century. St Benedict is known as the Father of Western monasticism, because it is under his influence that monasticism really took hold in Western Europe. In 1966, because of the huge influence he has had on our continent, he was named patron of Europe, along now with several other saints. Benedict was born at Nursia, Italy, and after completing his studies in Rome, at about the age of twenty, he left the world behind to become a monk. After experimenting with various forms of monastic life, he spent three years at Subiaco, living as a hermit. He attracted followers, and soon had a community of monks under his direction. Benedict moved South to Montecassino, because of the hostility of a local priest. There he founded a monastery, as he put it, "a school for the service of the Lord." He composed the famous Rule of St Benedict, which ultimately became the standard legislation for all monastic life in the Western Church. His motto was "Ora et labora", (pray and work), and his insignia was a plough and a cross. St Benedict placed great emphasis on personal love of Christ, humility and prudence. When his last hour approached, he was carried to the abbey church, where he expired whilst praying. Benedict successfully made the transition from being a hermit to the communal life of a monastery, using the wise principles contained in his rule. An excerpt from the Rule of St Benedict states that the monk should first "put Christ before all else," and secondly, follow Christ "by the guidance of the gospel." These instructions are valid not only for the monk, who dedicates his life to the "service of God," but for all Christians who are intent on pleasing God alone.
