St Augustine of Hippo ~ 28th August

St Augustine of Hippo is one of my favourite saints. I first learned to appreciate him when I was studying history at university. He was born at Thagaste, North Africa, in 354. As a young man he led an immoral life, and was unsettled in his convictions. His mother was a devout Catholic and prayed continually shedding tears for his conversion. She must have been a bit of a nuisance to him, from his point of view, turning up at university and telling him to reform his life. However, her prayers eventually won through. In 387 he was converted and received baptism from Saint Ambrose of Milan. He returned to Africa and lived an ascetic life. There he was elected as Bishop of Hippo, where he was an exemplary Bishop for 34 years. He died in the year 430 when the barbarians were besieging the city of Hippo. When everyone else was afraid that the crumbling Roman Empire and the incursions of the Barbarians heralded the end of the world, he assured the people of Hippo: "This is not an old world dying, this is a new world being born." We would do well to look on our own crumbling Western civili~ sation in the same way. Someone once joked to me that when you read St Augustine's writings there's something worth remembering every ten pages. Then you really hit gold. St Augustine left more writings behind him than any other figure in antiquity. The irony is that if we find his writings difficult to read, we must remember he didn't intend anyone else to read them. He was mostly writing purely for himself apart from his homilies. After his death his writings were stolen from his study. Here are two memorable sayings of his: "Act as if everything depends on you. Pray as if everything depends on God." "You stir us up, O Lord, and make us find joy in praising you, since you have made us for yourself; and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you."
