Fr Matthew's Catechesis The Season of Advent (Part 1)

We are now entering the beautiful season of Advent. We are all familiar with Advent calendars and wreaths, but do we really think about the inner meaning of this season? Let's start with basics. The word "advent" means coming, and the reason why this season is given that name is that it focuses on two distinct advents of Our Lord Jesus Christ - His second advent (coming) at the end of time, and His first advent at Christmas. In this first part of Advent until and including 16th December our meditation is on the Second Coming of Jesus. What does it mean for us? Will he come whilst we are still living this earthly life, or will he come when we are in the grave, and raise us up body and soul for the general judgement along with the living? Either way we should be prepared for His coming. We should have many good works to show him. We will need to give an account of our lives and how well we have spent them in His service. Rather than prematurely pressing the Christmas button, these first days of Advent until the middle of December are there for us to take stock and reflect on the way our lives are going. We need to examine our consciences and perhaps make a good confession during this time. We also need to make some resolutions as well, so that we can look forward to the Lord's Second Coming with joyful anticipation. If we live as friends of Jesus Christ, then love of Him will drive out all fear. For those of us who are close to Him throughout our lives Jesus Christ will not be a judge who is a stranger to us, because we try our best to serve him each day of our lives. We can, and should be, intimate friends of Jesus, who has to judge us. Listen to what one saint said of the judgement: "I was amused to hear you speak of the "account" that Our Lord will demand of you. No, for none of you will he be a judge in the harsh sense of the word; He will simply be Jesus." These lines, written by a good bishop, have consoled more than one troubled heart, and could well console yours. St Josemaria Escriva.

Are available at the back of Church. Please complete and return by 31st December 2022 WITH a copy of the child's baptismal certificate. NB: if you require a further copy of the baptismal certificate from either Holy Souls or St Bernadette's Churches a charge of £20 will apply.

School admissions to Catholic Primary Academies (Reception Year) - Children born between 01/09/2018 and 31/08/2019

The deadline for submitting your application for a school place is 15th January 2023. Application forms are available on your 'home' Local Authority website. For every Catholic school you apply for if you wish your child to be considered and ranked under a faith criterion you *must also complete a supplementary information form*, and return this form to the school by the deadline, (forms are available from the LA and the school). You MUST also include the *supporting evidence* as required eg baptism certificate (photocopies acceptable). Failure to supply the required evidence will mean your child is ranked in a lower criterion which may affect your chance of a place. If you do not have the required evidence please contact the parish where your child was baptised for a copy certificate in good time.
