Canon Matthew's Catechesis The Season of Advent (Part 2)

There is a Latin saying "Lex orandi, lex credendi". The Latin language has an ability to say an awful lot in just a few words, and that, I suppose, is why despite the decline and fall of the Roman Empire 1500 years ago, we still make use of their language in all educational disciplines and in the Church. "Lex orandi, lex credendi," literally means "the law of praying, is the law of believing". That is the words we use in prayer to inform our belief. Inspired by this idea, let us look at some of the prayers we use in the latter part of Advent. These will elucidate what we believe about this season. From the 17th December onwards, the focus of Advent changes from the second coming of Christ, to preparing to | • celebrate the great feast of his first coming at Christmas.

Therefore, the post communion prayer at Mass on the fourth Sunday of Advent gives us this theme: "We pray, almighty God, that, as the feast day of our salvation draws ever nearer, so we may press forward all the more eagerly to the worthy celebration of the mystery of your Son's Nativity." The tone of this prayer is one of joyful and even exciting anticipation. Note that we have to celebrate this great feast worthily, which means some spiritual preparation, perhaps by taking time to go to an extra weekday Mass; to make a good confession; and to do some spiritual reading and prayer. We must recall that the Nativity of Christ is referred to as a "mystery." This is a spiritual reality which doesn't easily give up its full meaning. It requires pondering on, as Our Lady did, and also prayer and study. It is a great mystery that God should become a man. How could this even be possible, given the tremendous difference between God's nature and ours? The condescension required for this step alone boggles the mind. I Bishops' Conferences around the world has been gathered, We, who have been brought up as Christians are frequently considered, discerned, and distilled into a Report which is unaware of how astounding our belief in the Word of God now being given to each continent to consider in light of made flesh is to others.

Preface II of Advent, which is mandated for all Advent Masses from 17th to 24th December, also sets the scene: "For all the oracles of the prophets foretold him, the Virgin Mother longed for him with love beyond all telling, John the Baptist sang of his coming and proclaimed his presence when he came." All the main aspects of Christ's birth were foretold in Old Testament prophecy. From Isaiah we get a prophecy of birth amongst animals (1 v.3), and later in the Book, the virgin birth, and saviour's divine nature. From Micah we learn of his birth in Bethlehem. From the psalms of David, we with the divine plan. Finally in Numbers chapter 24 the Church the Holy Spirit is calling us to become. prophet Balaam proclaims the coming of the Messiah, symbolized by a star giving light in the darkness: "A star shall come forth from Jacob." To these prophets, the last of the prophets John the Baptist added his testimony, dancing in the womb of his mother in the presence of the Virgin Mother of God. May we too, like Mary, John the Baptist and the prophets, long for his coming.
