**Canon Matthew's Catechism
The Penitential Rite of the Mass**

The Mass is like a mountain. It begins in quite a low-key manner, with the penitential rite, and we gradually ascend up the mountain, getting closer and closer to God. Rather like Moses as he ascended Mount Sinai to meet God face to face and talk with him.

I want to start off our journey with Moses, but in a different place. He was in the wilderness near Horeb, looking after the flock of Jethro his father-in-law. It was here that he had his first encounter with God. God appeared to him in the form of a burning bush, which was not consumed by the flames. Moses, aware that this was an unusual sight, went to investigate. Then a voice told him to take his sandals off, "Put off your shoes from your feet because the place on which you are standing is holy ground." It said (Ex. 3.5). When we attend Mass, we stand on holy ground. We don't take off our shoes like they do in some religions, but we need to recognize that we are approaching something very holy. So we need to prepare. This is what the penitential rite of the Mass is for. Firstly the priest asks everyone to call to mind their sins in order to prepare for Mass. This is no vain acknowledgement of our sins. It is all done with a purpose. The Church then requires a brief pause in which people examine their consciences. Then we confess in public that we are sinners, both priest and people, with the "I confess" or some other act of contrition. There are three different forms. Then the absolution follows: "May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life." In these words, the priest absolves himself and everyone present. This lacks the full effect of going to confession. But we can be sure that all but the most serious sins are forgiven by God at this point of the Mass.
