Canon Matthew's Catechism

What did God reveal about himself when he sent His Son to earth?

In the eighth century the Iconoclast controversy was raging in the Catholic Church. This was a dispute between those who did and didn't favour the use of sacred images and statues in churches and in private devotion. St John Damascene wrote in favour of those who supported sacred images, saying that in the incarnation (ie the coming of God in the flesh) the hidden face of God had been revealed. Therefore, it was now possible to represent God in art, and following on from that the images of the angels and saints. The Second Council of Nicaea upheld this teaching and we have been using sacred images ever since. The incarnation was therefore so radical that it overturned the first of the Ten Commandments forbidding the creation of images.

In the first chapter of St John's Gospel, we are told "The Word (ie Jesus Christ, God the Son) was made flesh and dwelt among us." In the original Greek (St John's Gospel was originally written in Greek) this sentence literally reads "The Word was made flesh and pitched his tent among us." This translation brings home to us that Jesus Christ, in becoming a man, embraced all the circumstances of human existence: tiredness, anxiety, suffering, fear of death, having to work hard to earn a living, human love, joy and happiness, limitations in knowledge and so on.

It is amazing that Almighty God would be willing to do such a thing out of love for mankind and indeed the whole of His creation, for it was the whole of creation he came to redeem, not just mankind. Think what a come down and a sacrifice this was. In many ways, it is like a human being voluntarily, for some noble reason, being willing to become an ant! (In some ways this analogy has limitations, because both God the Son and a human being are rational beings, persons, whereas an ant certainly is not). This bold and infinitely generous step on the part of God the Son, reveals to us the hidden face of the Father's love.
