Canon Matthew's Catechism

With the Incarnation of Jesus Christ has everything been said, or does God continue to reveal new truths to mankind?

The word "Incarnation" derives from the Latin word "carnis" meaning "flesh", and refers to the coming in the flesh of God to this earth. It is the Catholic faith that with the coming of Jesus Christ, all that is necessary for salvation has now been revealed, and that no new revealed truths will be given to us. We speak of the *Age of Revelation* having been closed with the death of the last apostle, the last definitive witness to the teaching of Jesus Christ. However, this does not mean that our understanding of divine revelation does not deepen over time. This has certainly happened in the past two thousand years as the wider implications of the teachings of Jesus Christ have been better understood. For example, it took until the end of the Middle Ages for the Church to publicly condemn the evils of slavery. Only gradually was the dignity of each individual human being realized, as the implications of Christian teaching were better understood. There is also the phenomenon of private revelation. Examples of private revelation are the apparitions at Lourdes, Fatima and Guadalupe. Here, although messages have been given to individuals by the Blessed Virgin Mary, there is no requirement for Catholics to believe in such phenomena even after such apparitions have been approved by the Church. The Church leaves it to our own judgement whether or not we believe in such things. Secondly, messages of private revelation only help us to a deeper appreciation of the Gospel and do not reveal new truths.
