

Statement of the Right Reverend Patrick McKinney Bishop of Nottingham, upon the election of Pope Leo XIV

Thursday 8th May 2025

The College of Cardinals has elected Cardinal Robert Prevos as the 267th Pope. He has taken the name Pope Leo XIV ir succession to Pope Leo XIII who was known for his social teaching and keen interest in social issues.

Pope Leo XIV greeted Rome and the world from St Peter's balcony this early evening, on 8th May 2025, in both Italian and Spanish. Smiling warmly at the huge crowds in St Peter's Square he wished everyone the peace of Christ and encouraged the Church to build bridges between people and to work for dialogue and peace. This reminded the crowd of themes that Pope Francis often spoke of, and his words were greeted with warm applause.

Following the election of Pope Leo XIV, Bishop Patrick McKinney, Bishop of Nottingham, issued the following statement: "I am overjoyed to hear of the election of Pope Leo XIV, the first American Pope, but also a missionary religious, an Augustinian, who has spent many years ministering in Peru and travelling widely. I wish to assure the new Pope of my prayers and good wishes, and that of Catholics throughout the Diocese of Nottingham, as he begins his ministry as the successor of St Peter. His rich and varied experience will be a huge blessing to the Catholic Church and to the wider world. May God bless and guide him."

Pope Adrian IV, Lincolnshire's Pope

As we enter into the papal conclave, and hopefully soon hear news of our new pope, it is good to know that we Lincolnshire people have a pope of our own. Pope Adrian IV was born Nicholas Breakspear in about 1100, the only Englishman ever to have become pope. Adrian was born in Hertfordshire, but little is known of his early life. After his ordination he served for some time as priest at Tydd St Mary's in Lincolnshire. He travelled to the south of France where he studied law. He became a monk of the Abbey of Saint-Ruf, in France, eventually becoming the abbot. He travelled to Rome several times, where he appears to have caught the attention of Pope Eugene III, and was appointed Bishop of Albano in about 1149. He acquired the reputation of being a firm disciplinarian, and was sent on various diplomatic missions by the Pope. He was sent to Scandinavia, where he re-organised the church in Norway and Sweden. In Sweden he was acclaimed by the people as a saint. Breakspear returned to Rome in 1154. Pope Eugene's successor, Pope Anastasius, had died only a few weeks previously. For reasons now unknown Breakspear was elected by the cardinals. His was a turbulent papacy. Rome was at that time a den of heresy and republicanism, so much so, that he was unable to complete his coronation as pope. At the time the Holy Roman Emperor and the Normans were also putting military pressure on the pope's possessions in Italy However, he soon moved to decisively reassert papal authority over Rome and the Papal States. In 1158 Adrian is supposed to have granted Henry II of England the papal bul Laudabiliter authorising him to invade Ireland. Adrian' pontificate is debated by historians, who admire his building programme in Rome and his reorganisation of papal finance es. However, he had to contend with foreign military pow ers, which although he could not defeat, he managed effectively. He died on 1st September 1159, but was never canonized.
