Thomas Arthur Young, a Local Catholic Hero

Thomas Arthur Young was a wealthy Catholic landowner, who lived at Kingerby Hall near to Market Rasen. He is a key figure in the shaping of Catholicism as it emerged from II make sure we follow these rules to make it a safe place. Evethe era of persecution here in Lincolnshire. He had been born in a time when there were still many penal laws against Catholics and they faced much discrimination. However by the mid nineteenth century Catholics had been emancipated and it was now possible to start building churches. He therefore decided to spend his large fortune building churches for the increasing Catholic population. T A Young closed his hall at Kingerby to save up money for his projects. He went to live in a small thatched cottage at Middle Rasen. Soon his building projects began. In 1868, together with contributions from local Catholics, he enlarged Holy Rood Church at Market Rasen, adding a north and south aisle and tower. He also bore the cost of the church and presbytery of St Thomas of Canterbury, Gainsborough, which opened in 1867. He purchased five acres of land at Crowle, and funded the construction of St Norbert's Church and Priory, opened in 1872. In Spalding he bore the cost of a Catholic Church and Presbytery opened in 1878. The Heneage family presented the Catholics of Grimsby with a large plot of land in 1871. On this site T A Young built St Mary's Church and Presbytery, opened in 1883. In Lincoln the Diocese of Nottingham opposed the construction of a church by T A Young, but he did succeed in building two houses for use by the Church. When Thomas Arthur Young died, Bishop Bagshaw of Nottingham preached at his funeral saying "He lived these long 87 years with an ample income which would have enabled him to take his place in the world and live in comfort, nay even in splendour and luxury, but he made himself poor for Christ's sake and lived as a poor man with the plainest of comforts, so that nothing could interfere with his self-devotion to God." Thomas Arthur Young's generosity to Lincolnshire's Catholics continued after his death. Holy Souls Church, Scunthorpe, was completed in 1912, largely financed by a trust set up in Young's will.
