St Josephine Bakhita Feast Day
8th February

St Josephine Bakhita is the patron saint of victims of human trafficking and modern slavery. St Scholastica - 10th February

Scholastica, the twin sister of St Benedict, was born at Norcia in Italy. She consecrated herself to God from her earliest years and remained at home with her father, whilst Benedict went off to Rome for his education. According to Gregory the Great, it is likely that while Benedict went off to live at the monastery of Subiaco, Scholastica went to live at a monastery nearby. Later, in order to stay close to her brother, Scholastica followed him to Montecassino, where she died in 547. The office of readings for this day describes the annual visit between Benedict and Scholastica, which took place in a house separate from the monastery. On one occasion Scholastica wanted Benedict to return home to his monastery the following day. Benedict refused. Then, as St Gregory reports, Scholastica prayed to God and such a violent thunder storm arose that Benedict and his companions could not leave the house. "What have you done?" asked Benedict. She answered "I asked you, and you would not listen, so I asked my God and he did listen." The lesson for us is summarized in the comment of St Gregory the Great: "Since, as John says, God is love, then surely he can do more who loves more."

Livestreaming Mass at Holy Souls Church Update

Work has begun to install the infrastructure to livestream services at Holy Souls' Church. This will enable parishioners, families and friends - who are unable to attend in person - to share in our Liturgies. Funeral Services and other Services may also be livestreamed, where requested.

The camera will be located at the side of the Church facing the altar so during the service the Sanctuary and the backs of people occupying the front two rows will be visible. Further details are available on the church noticeboards.

The livestream feed is censored to respect your privacy at moments during services such as Communion when individuals are at the front of the Church. Participants who will be visible in the Sanctuary during a livestreamed service includes Clergy, Altar servers, Readers and Eucharistic Ministers, so it is important that consent to be filmed/withdrawing consent is

obtained. Can parishioners in these roles please collect an envelope at the back of Church to complete and **return to Holy Souls' Church Sacristy by 10th February 2026**. This will help in our planning of livestreamed and non-livestreamed services from mid February 2026.
