Second Reading 1 Peter 3:18-22

Some Lenten Characteristics

The Church marks the more sombre nature of Lent in a variety of ways. Visually there are no flowers in the Church building and the priest and deacon wear purple vestments. (Later in Lent some of our statues may be covered up too). There is no playing of instruments except to support congregational singing. The word 'Alleluia' is not used during Lent and alternative Gospel acclamations are provided for us.

We may well miss some of our favourite sights and sounds over the coming six weeks, but we will be able to appreciate them all the more when they return spectacularly at Easter.
