

## Readings for Fourth Sunday of Lent

### First Reading

2 Chronicles 36:14-16.19-23

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy. Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke: through Jeremiah, Until this land has enjoyed its Sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep Sabbath throughout the days of its desolation. And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up.

### Second Reading

Ephesians 2:4-10

God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy; when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ - it is through grace that you have been saved - and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus. This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it. **The Word of the Lord.**

**Gospel Acclamation:** *Praise to you, O Christ King of eternal glory! God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son; everyone who believes in him has eternal life. Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory!*

### Gospel Reading

John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son. On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God." **The Gospel of the Lord.**

### You are Living Stones

Following the Bishop's Pastoral Letter in which he asked Parish Priests to organise parish meetings to discuss this document, Fr Eddy proposes that we meet on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm in the Hall. We will begin by reflecting prayerfully on Jesus meeting his disciples on the road to Emmaus, go on to look at the available statistics about the likely numbers of priests in the coming years, and end by discussing what the implications for our parish might be. Among the questions we will consider: what more can we all do to help our parish? How can our parish work more closely with our neighbouring parishes? What difference will it make if we have to share our Parish Priest with another parish or/and if we no longer have the ministry of a deacon in our community? Please give the matter some thought and prayer and Fr Eddy looks forward to seeing and hearing you on the 26<sup>th</sup>!

### The Forge

We have been asked for help as follows: Food that can be used to make 24

hour packs that can be given for rough sleepers and others in need. Food hampers for families with children, ie anything to provide a nutritious diet such as canned fish (sardines in tomato sauce), pots of rice pudding, fruit pots, small individual cartons of pure apple/orange juice, small cartons of milk (1 pt as any more than this is too heavy for people to carry around with them), canned meat that can be sliced, sandwich fillers, eggs, biscuits, cake, crisps and snacks etc. We need people who can volunteer to help prepare, cook and serve meals on Mondays/Wednesdays on a rota basis. You don't have to be available every week but ANY time you can give would be appreciated. Food supplies can be brought to the sacristy after Mass.
