### First Reading

Kings 3:11-14

The Lord said to Solomon, 'Since you have not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgment for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. I give you a heart wise and shrewd as none before you has had and none will have after you. What you have not asked I shall give you too: such riches and glory as no other king ever had. And I will give you a long life, if you follow my ways, keeping my laws and commandments, as your father David followed them.' **The Word of the Lord.**

Ps: 32:4-6.9.18-20.22

[R]: *Happy the people the Lord has chosen as his own.*

### Second Reading

Romans 8:14-17

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory. **The Word of the Lord.**

**Gospel Acclamation:** *Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, the God who is, the God who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!*

### Gospel Reading

Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.' **The Gospel of the Lord.**

### Creed

Now that the Easter season is over we will return to using the Nicene Creed for our Profession of Faith. The Nicene Creed (full name Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed) derives from the first two Ecumenical Councils of the Church, the Council of Nicaea (325) which affirmed the divinity of Jesus, the Son of God, and the First Council of Constantinople (381) which affirmed the divinity of the Holy Spirit. Thus it is particularly appropriate to resume using it on Trinity Sunday.
