Deanery Update

At the recent Clergy Deanery Meeting, the pr iests of the Deanery decided not to proceed, for the time being, with the planned changes to Mass times, but rather to await further developments at Diocesan level in the 'You are Living Stones' process. These are expected in February 2013.

Stained Glass Windows

If you look around the Church you will notice stained glass windows to honour the silver jubilee (behind the altar) and the golden jubilee (the rose window) of the Church. Should we not consider leaving a similar permanent reminder of our centenary year? The matter has been discussed at the PPC and the consensus was that this would be a fitting idea. We talked about the possibility of two new windows one depicting St Augustine Webster, and the other depicting Blessed Pope John Paul II. We would like the designs to come from the people of the parish, with a particular desire to involve children/young people. So we invite people to submit 'sketch designs' featuring either one of the two people named above. Designs need to observe a proportion of 4 parts vertical to 1 part horizontal and should be submitted by Sunday 4th November. In due course designs would be exhibited and people could vote for the ones they like. These would then be sent to professional stained glass designers who would work with them to prepare a final design.

First Communion

Parents of Year 3 children or older who hope to make their First Holy Communion this academic year are invited to a meeting in the Hall on Thursday 8th November at 7.00pm. This meeting is for parents only and details of how the programme will run and the level of commitment and participation required from children and parents will be explained. The programme is open to all children in the parish of the appropriate age regardless of which school they attend.

Confirmation

Bishop Malcolm will celebrate this Sac~ rament in June 2013. In line with Diocesan policy those who are already at Secondary school are eligible to be Confirmed. A Confirmation Programme, led by the Reach 4 team from the Briars, will be run jointly for the two Scunthorpe parishes beginning in February 2013. Any young people wishing to be Confirmed please pick up an application form from Fr Eddy in the Sacristy. These must be returned by 1st November 2012. There will be a meeting for parents of potential candidates on Thursday 15th November at 7.30 pm at Holy Souls Hall. At that meeting more information will be given about the programme, and in particular about the level of commitment and participation that will be required.
