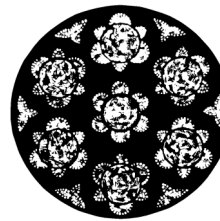

First Reading

Isaiah 53:10-11

The Lord has been pleased to crush his servant with suffering. If he offers his life in atonement, he shall see his heirs, he shall have a long life and through him what the Lord wishes will be done. His souls anguish over he shall see the light and be content. By his sufferings shall my servant justify many, taking their faults on himself. **The Word of the Lord.**

Second Reading

Hebrews 4:14-16

Since in Jesus, the Son of God, we have the supreme high priest who has gone through to the highest heaven, we must never let go of the faith that we have professed. For it is not as if we had a high priest who was incapable of feeling our weaknesses with us; but we have one who has been tempted in every way that we are, though he is without sin. Let us be confident, then, in approaching the throne of grace, that we shall have mercy from him and find grace when we are in need of help. **The Word of the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: *Alleluia, alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia!*

Gospel Reading

Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.' When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' **The Gospel of the Lord.**

Parish Finance

Having reached the half-way point of our Financial Year the following figures are available. During the six months April to September the total collection income (including Standing Orders) was £19,977 which is an average weekly collection of £765. Thank you to everyone for your generous giving. During the same period various fund raising activities in the Hall generated a further £1,532, again a big thanks to all those who have worked hard to achieve this. Our Mis-

sion Fund stands at just over £1,000. This money is used to respond to various appeals in line with the Mission of the Church we receive throughout the year which do not have a second collection of their own. Your suggestions for possible recipients are most welcome.

Trees

The situation of the trees in front of the Church was discussed at the last PPC meeting, and Fr Eddy has also sought the advice of a tree specialist. The trees do restrict the amount of light that comes into the Church, especially through the Rose Window. There are two options, either leave things as they are, or cut down the trees allowing more light into the Church. If we were to cut down the trees we could consider replacing them with new trees that would not grow so tall. PPC members would be pleased to hear your thoughts.

Lourdes - HCPT

A couple of weeks ago Fr Eddy and George Smith took part in a Pilgrimage to Lourdes under the auspices of a national charity known as HCPT. We travelled as part of a group of some 30 pilgrims and we stayed at Hosanna House which is a short distance away from Lourdes, but we visited Lourdes

every day. The group consisted of some pilgrims who needed assistance and others who were willing to give generously of their time to help. This particular group was led by a married couple from Fr Eddy's previous parish and they plan to go again next year, probably early September.
