Update on Organ

Fr Eddy, Brian Harris, James Longden, and David Lisle have been investigating the best way forward regarding the organ. They have looked at a number of different organs and have spoken to organ builders and representatives to consider both an overhaul of our present organ and the purchase of a new digital organ. There are a number of problems with our current organ, not all of which can be rectified, and the cost of overhaul is similar to the purchase price of a new digital organ. Therefore it is the consensus of opinion that the purchase of a new digital organ to replace our current organ will prove to be the best way forward. However, so that parishioners can hear and see for themselves what additional possibilities a digital organ offers, it is proposed that such an organ be "trialled" for a few weeks. When the digital organ is with us at least one demonstration meeting will be arranged so that parishioners can hear and see both the current and the possible replacement organ and ask any questions they may have.
