

Readings for the First Sunday of Lent – Year C

First Reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: The priest shall take the panner from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me. You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God. **The word of the Lord.**

Ps: 90:1-2.10-15

[R]: *Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.*

Second Reading

Romans 10:8-13

Scripture says: The word, that is the faith we proclaim, is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask for his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. **The Word of the Lord.**

Gospel Acclamation: *Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory!*

Gospel Reading

Luke 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone. Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time. **The Gospel of the Lord.**

STATEMENT BY THE BISHOP OF NOTTINGHAM ON THE RESIGNATION OF POPE BENEDICT

“Along with Catholics throughout the world, I was shocked and surprised to learn of Pope Benedict XVI’s intention to resign this morning. During his seven years as Pope, he has made a big impact on the Catholic Church and beyond, in his teaching, in his demeanour and in the example which he has given of fidelity to his calling, and he has been an ardent and faithful servant of the Gospel. None of us can forget his Apostolic Visit to this country in 2010. Catholics in the Diocese of Nottingham will all be praying for Pope Benedict as he prepares for his retirement, and for the College of Cardinals as they prepare to meet in Rome to elect his successor. The election of a Pope is a key moment in the life of the Church, and I hope and pray that the Cardinals will make a wise choice, guided as they will be by the Holy Spirit.”
