<u>First Reading</u> 1 Samuel 16:1.6-7.10-13

The Lord said to Samuel, Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen myself a king among his sons. When Samuel arrived, he caught sight of Eliab and thought, Surely the Lords anointed one stands there before him, but the Lord said to Samuel, Take no notice of his appearance or his height for I have rejected him; God does not see as man sees; man looks at appearances but the Lord looks at the heart. Jesse presented his seven sons to Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, The Lord has not chosen these. He then asked Jesse, Are these all the sons you have? He answered, There is still one left, the youngest; he is out looking after the sheep. Then Samuel said to Jesse, Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he comes. Jesse had him sent for, a boy of fresh complexion, with fine eyes and pleasant bearing. The Lord said Come, anoint him, for this is the one. At this, Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him where he stood with his brothers; and the spirit of the Lord seized on David and stayed with him from that day on.

Second Reading

Fighesians 5:8-14

You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord; be like children of light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth. Try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing to do with the futile works of darkness but exposing them by contrast. The things which are done in secret are things that people are ashamed even to speak of; but anything exposed by the light will be illuminated and anything illuminated turns into light. That is why it is said: Wake up from your sleep, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you. The Word of the Lord.

Gospel Reading John 9:1-41

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored. His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.'.... They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a Sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the Sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man. 'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away. Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him. The Gospel of the Lord.

Update from Father Colum Kelly at Seafarers Centre Immingham

The good news is that watching the building dry is almost at an end. Of the 17 heater/dehumidifier systems that have been running for 10 weeks, now we only have 2. It is anticipated that we will be declared dry by the middle of next week. It seems that someone has to come and give us a certificate to that effect and then work can begin in earnest. The first phase will be a total re-wire of the electric system, installation of cables for internet, for phone lines, fire and security alarms. When all of that is complete, the plastering will begin, new ceilings fitted and floors covered.

The building will not be returned to its pre December 4 lay out. Good as it was, we now have the chance to create a centre totally geared to the needs of today's seafarers and shame on us if we cannot get it right. The main difference will be the removal of the bar area and in its place a café bar lounge. It is hoped that a limited selection of hot food can be served during the day. There will be an area reserved exclusively for the use of seafarers. Meanwhile the mission continues in a mobile sense. I spend most of my days putting mobile internet connections on ships and bringing phone cards to crews. The need for communication with families will always be the primary need for seafarers.'

the celebration Mass will be shared with the Polish community, and will hopefully be a chance to get to know one another a bit better.

Baptism Preparation Evening

This will take place on Wednesday 21st May from 7.00 pm to 9.00 pm.
