There came a mighty wind, so strong it tore the mountains and shattered the rocks before the Lord. But the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind came an earthquake. But the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire. But the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire there came the sound of a gentle breeze. And when Elijah heard this, he covered his face with his cloak and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. **The Word of the Lord.**

Romans 9:1-5

What I want to say is no pretence; I say it in union with Christ - it is the truth - my conscience in union with the Holy Spirit assures me of it too. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. Our Parish and the First World War

'The first Mass according to the Catholic Rite to be held in Scunthorpe since the Reformation is believed to have taken place on All Souls Day, 2nd November 1892. Fr Michael Kirby, Parish Priest of Brigg, offered up the Holy Sacrifice in a house on Mary Street owned by a Mr E Field of Winterringham whose family were recent converts to the faith. This Mass was in effect the beginning of the modern Catholic Mission in the town of Scunthorpe (and the date is probably the reason for the somewhat unusual dedication of our church).' Fr Eddy recently had a phone call from someone who introduced himself as a great grandson of Mr Elias William Field. Elias William Field served in the Lincolnshire Yeomanry and died on 22nd December 1915 having been wounded when the ship, on which he was travelling to Egypt, was shot by a German submarine. He is buried in a military cemetery in Algeria and his name is to be found on the war memorial at Winterringham. As over the coming four years we remember the events of the First World War it would be good to remember as a parish those early founders, parishioners and benefactors of our parish who lost their lives at that time. If you have any family memories that you wish to share they will be gratefully received.
