The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest - it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.' The Gospel of the Lord.

Praying for the 'Holy Souls'

The Holy Souls are those who 'die in God's grace and friendship and are assured of their eternal salvation, but still undergo purification after death so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven' (Catechism of the Catholic Church para 1030). There is no day on which we can say of a particular soul that they have completed their purification. The Church encourages us to pray for all 'the departed' as though they were still in purgatory, unless they have officially listed as saints in glory. Our prayers are never wasted. God accepts them as powerful offerings of love. The greatest prayer we can offer is the Mass. That is why we have a custom of offering Masses for the souls of the departed. Such Masses are often requested on the occasion of a death and funeral or on significant anniversaries but can be requested at any time. If you wish to arrange for a Mass to be offered please speak to one of the clergy in the sacristy. Intentions for weekend Masses are often booked up a number of weeks in advance.
