Blessed Archbishop Oscar Romero

Last weekend saw the Beatification of Archbishop Romero from El Salvador who was shot whilst celebrating Mass 35 years ago. In an interview two weeks before his assassination he had said, "I have frequently been threatened with death Martyrdom is a great gift from God that I do not believe I have earned. But if God accepts the sacrifice of my life then may my blood be the seed of liberty and a sign of the hope that will soon become a reality A Bishop will die, but the Church of God – the people – will never die." In a message issued for the Beatification Pope Francis recalled: 'the Lord granted his Church a zealous Bishop who, loving God and serving the brothers and sisters, converted into an image of Christ the Good Shepherd. In times of difficult coexistence, Archbishop Romero knew how to lead, defend and protect his flock, remaining faithful to the Gospel and in communion with the whole Church. His ministry was distinguished by a particular attention to the most poor and marginalized. And in the moment of his death, while he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of love and reconciliation, he received the grace to identify himself fully with He who gave his life for his sheep.'
