First Reading Jeremiah 23:1-6

Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered - it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures; they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost - it is the Lord who speaks! See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks – when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity. The Word of the Lord.

Second Reading Ephesians 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father. **The Word of the Lord.**

## Report on the organ

Over the past few months our organists have found our organ increasingly difficult to play and at their suggestion Fr Eddy asked an independent organ consultant to look at our organ and present a report. If any parishioners would like a copy of the full report please let Fr Eddy know, but these quotes give the basic gist of what he says: 'The condition of the organ is appalling ... it is impossible for any but a small tuner comfortably to get inside ... there is no point in attempting to make good what is now in place ... the current location an organ of even this modest size is hopeless, and in any case the quality of what we have is mediocre at best.' As to a solution the consultant suggests that we consider acquiring a 'second hand instrument of musical worth, and to place it not actually at the west end (back) of the church, but somewhat forward of it, perhaps somewhere near where the font currently is'. Fr Eddy would be happy to hear the thoughts of parishioners as to whether they would wish him to explore this option further.

Those living in the Scunthorpe constituency should note that when Nic Dakin wrote to Fr Eddy prior to the election he said that he would 'listen carefully to the local and national debate and be informed by that' on the matter of assisted suicide. Therefore there is every point in writing to him and expressing your views clearly and respectfully.
