Canon's Ramblings

The Feast of the Epiphany commemorates not just the visit of the Magi but also includes a remembrance of Jesus's baptism in the Jordan and the miracle of the wedding feast at Cana. This is summed up by one of the antiphons from the Divine Office for the Epiphany: Three wonders mark this day we celebrate: today the star led the Magi to the manger; today water was changed into wine at the marriage feast; today Christ desired to be baptised by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation, alleluia' and is also expressed in the old Xwords of the hymn 'Songs of Thankfulness and Praise' (661 in our hymn books). This year is a good year to be reminded of this threefold dimension as we will hear the Gospel accounts of those three events over consecutive Sundays and so we will be able to appreciate the similarities, difference, and connections linking these events as Jesus's true identity is revealed.

On another note I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their cards, gifts, and Christmas offerings. Your kindness and generosity is much appreciated. Deacon Bernard is likewise grateful. As the New Year unfolds I am sure that people are aware that we have an early Easter this year (Sunday March 27th) which means that we have an early start to Lent (10th February). So enjoy what remains of the Christmas Season, but be mindful that Lent is not too far away.
