Canon's Ramblings

I am sure that all of us know the Our Father and Hail Mary by heart, but how many other prayers do we know? I suspect that many of the prayers that are familiar to those of an older generation are not equally familiar to those of a younger one. One such prayer might be the 'Hail, Holy Queen' which is often said at the conclusion of the rosary or sung in Latin (Salve Regina) at the end of evening or night prayer of the Church. It is a prayer that Pope Francis commends for our use during this Jubilee of Mercy, so for the benefit of those who do not (yet) know it these are the words:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of Mercy,

Hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope.

To thee do we cry,

Poor banished children of Eve;

To thee do we send up our sighs,

Mourning and weeping in this vale of tears.

Turn then, most gracious advocate,

Thine eyes of mercy toward us;

And after this our exile,
