This Week

New Organ - the new organ arrived on Wednesday and we will hear it for the first time this weekend. The current location of the console and the speakers is only temporary. It is hoped that eventually the console will go in the alcove that houses the old organ once we are able to remove it and that the speakers at the back of the church will be mounted higher on the west wall.

Mass and Healing Service - at St Bernadette's next Tuesday, 2nd August at 3.00 pm, for deceased member of SPANNED, together with a healing service. There will be light refreshments afterwards. This is open not just to the sick and housebound but to all carrying burdens and in need of healing.

Change to weekend Masses - next weekend (6th/7th) there will be no Saturday 5.30 pm Mass at Holy Souls and no Sunday 8.30 am Mass at St Bernadette's as there will only be one priest covering Scunthorpe. Fr Dominic and Fr Eddy hope that those parishioners who usually attend those Masses will be able to make other arrangements for that weekend.

Thank you to those parishioners and visitors who brought the problems to Fr Eddy's attention. Confirmation

A reminder that Bishop Patrick will be visiting us on Friday 23rd September to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. We have a group of 20 young people who have been preparing for this Sacrament since January together with a similar sized group from St Bernadette's. Although they will have a break from catechesis over the summer holidays, they will still be continuing their preparation not least through prayer. All parishioners are asked to support them by joining their own prayers to those of the confirmation candidates.

Canon's Ramblings

Despite it being the first week of the school holidays it has been a busy and eventful week. On Wednesday we said a prayerful farewell to Margaret Egan a faithful and longstanding member of our parish. As we prepared to sing our final hymn 'Faith of our Fathers' I noted that this was not only Margaret's favourite hymn but also an appropriate hymn with which to retire our organ which has served us well since just after the end of World War II. Later that afternoon our new organ arrived which I hope will serve us equally well for many years.

Away from our own parish I am sure that many of us have been deeply affected by the news of the murder of Fr Jaques Hamel in France. May he rest in peace. Nationally there have been two types of responses. Church and faith leaders have called for prayer, and for solidarity between people of faith making sure that such events do not lead to prejudice and division. On the other hand the police have advised churches to be alert but not alarmed, and to review their current security plans and to be vigilant. I endorse both these responses, and I will continue to develop good relations with other church and religious leaders in our neighbourhood, but I will also follow good advice regarding the safety of the church building and especially of the people who live, work, and worship in our church including myself.
