### Canon's Ramblings

Our Lenten preparations are now behind us and we enter into the joy of Easter. Jesus, who was truly crucified and who truly died, is now risen and will die no more.

The Season of Easter lasts for 50 days and we should mark it with the same distinctiveness with which we mark Lent. For the first 40 days we remember Jesus appearing to his apostles on a number of occasions and teaching them about the Kingdom of God (Acts 1:3).

Perhaps we too could mark these days by making time to listen to the Lord and in our prayer ask him to teach us too about the Kingdom. For the last nine days we join with the apostles and Our Lady in praying for the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:14) so that we too can be witnesses to Jesus even 'to the ends of the earth'.
